

Calls related to noise and disorderly conduct continues to go down as the weather cools. Criminal mischiefs continue to be high primarily to two incidents on November 13th and November 26th. On the 13th over a dozen vehicles had the tires cut or windows broken in a one block radius around Tomichi Ave. and 8th St. and a second group occurred around Georgia Ave. and 11th St. On the 26th two vehicles were damaged in the 200 Blk. N 8th Stand St. No motive for the damage has been identified and the police department is looking for leads. In November's report I indicated two individuals were being held in South Carolina on warrants for Fraud. One person has since waived and was returned to Gunnison last week. The second person is still pending a governor's warrant.

Transports and extraditions are a fact of life for the police department. In past reports I've indicated that transports for mental, drug and alcohol treatment are up. No one has a reason but all agencies dealing with his population are seeing an increase. In a related area we are contacting more suspects out of state than typical resulting in extradition concerns. So far this year we have expended \$7750 on transports in state and \$4050 on extraditions from outside Colorado.

On the 8th Laurie and Chuck attended the final 9-1-1 Cassidian demonstration in Montrose, also attended by Delta Comm. Center. On November the 30th Chuck made a recommendation to the 9-1-1 Authority Board to accept Cassidian as the new 9-1-1 vendor. Chuck's recommendation was approved and the 911 Authority Board budgeted \$250,000 for 2012 to install the new system. The work begins now to start working out the details of the system, options, installation time tables and facility needs, working with Century Link and Cassidian Engineers

Laurie and Chuck attended a “Conflict and Confrontation” training class in Grand Junction, on the 15th, learning management leadership skills. On the 28th Chief Robinson and Chuck attended, along with GIS experts from the city and county, a demonstration of “Pictometry” software. Pictometry provides an aerial photographic view from not only straight down but from all four angles which can then be linked with typical GIS type attributes. The technology has many applications for emergency services as well as other government and private applications. The county is going to look further into the possibilities, so more may be coming in the future.

Statistically speaking, November was one of our slower months. So we can catch our breath before ski, snowmobiling, and hazardous weather accident season.
