Following last month's report some interest was shown in wanting traffic data. The general category breakdowns are shown here. If, council is interested I can break the type of violations down further but would like to do that on request as the types of violations change month to month and no consistent grouping exists. As you will notice there is a large increase in bike warning. This is primarily due to council's request. State statute requires a written communications be given to all vehicle drivers when stopped identifying the officer. By policy this has been a written warning, but a business card is allowed, so some numbers for moving violations are available. Bike warnings have been less documented and verbal warnings were allowed. The only way to gain any documentation is to issue a written warning which was reinforced to the officers.

June's activities consisted of handling calls for service and reports with nothing standing out as unusual. We did spend a lot of time planning for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July which came off without any significant problems. Crowds in the park this year appeared to be higher than normal and the traffic detour continues to help by getting the highway traffic out of the middle of the crowd area. It may appear that there is a lot of congestion at the end of the fireworks but traffic is able to be moved out of the area and be returned to normal in

approximately 30 minutes. Planning for the 4<sup>th</sup> moved right into planning for Cattlemen's Days and hopefully the crowds in town remain high.

Work on the new building is progressing nicely. We are working on finalizing a building schedule but it appears work will be starting on the foundation the week of July 8<sup>th</sup>. This is a large project bringing into play work from all the departments to get the building constructed and in budget. Weekly meeting will be held on Thursday mornings so if you want an update Thursday would be a good day to ask for new information.

Communications is finishing up the selection process for a new dispatcher. Peggy Castenholz has turned in her resignation for August 1<sup>st</sup> and is moving out of state. The police department is also starting the higher process for a new patrol officer as Joe Schriener turned in his resignation effective July 5<sup>th</sup> so he could take a patrol officers position with the Vail Police Department.

Chuck and Laurie are staying busy working on equipment needs for the new building. Review, proposals and contracts have been done for the 911 phone system, recording system and consoles. Coordinating ordering, installation, training and implementation as we move toward building completion will be a large undertaking.
