Rob is back in the public schools interacting with the kids and faculty. He is getting class schedules arranged for the year and setting up the office provided at the high school. Joe is putting the final preparation on the Good Neighbor Program which is scheduled for September 17<sup>th</sup>. This program involves member of the police department and students and staff from WSCU visiting neighborhoods in Gunnison to talk to residence and share information about being a good neighbor. Chris Danos is also teaching the policing class for the sociology department two days a week at WSCU.

The police department will be testing for police officers on September 12<sup>th</sup> in the hopes of selecting someone to fill or current opening. At last count we have 6 applicants planning to attend.

Four Officers attended a week long Mesa Tactical training put on by POST in Grand Junction. The police department also hosted and attended a legal update and case law training put on by the Colorado District Attorney's Council.

Work is continuing on the new building. Ken is doing a good job at keeping council current on the construction. We are continuing to evaluate and order interior electronics and equipment to meet the construction time line as we identify the need and costs. The 911 Board at the September meeting agreed reallocate any money saved on specific equipment purchases to the general line item thus insuring we have a full \$413,000 to spend on communications.

On August the 14<sup>th</sup> Supervisor Laurie Sherman and Chuck hosted the WCSU Security crew for a show and tell and training secession with the group, none of which had seen our 9-1-1/comm. Center and I believe it to have been informative for them.

On August the 2<sup>nd</sup> Communications Officer Peggy Castenholz completed her last day in dispatch; she is headed for the Sanoma Valley in California. On August the 6<sup>th</sup> Kelly Asbury began her six month training program in the Communications Center, all the best to Kelly, she comes to in a roundabout way from the EMS crew at GVH, and welcome.

Of note are the 9-1-1 phone calls in July, which as noted are report one month behind. Chuck compared last year's 9-1-1 calls; in 2012 we received 715 and in 2013 we received 873. So in Chuck's words, "I think it is another 9-1-1 record for the 9-1-1 center".
