Much of this was already reported at the last council meeting. Dispatch made the transfer to the new building in the early morning hours of December 18th. The move went without any major hitches and dispatch services were fully functional in the new building by 7AM. The police function made the final move on December 27 with desks, files and boxes being moved by Alpine Moving on December 27th and 28th. There was some consideration put into hiring a company to do the move but in the end it was a very timely decision. With the amount of stuff to move it could not have been accomplished in two days without their help. Additionally, the elevator in City Hall choose that week to fail and one of Alpines' workers injured their knee in the move.

Everyone is settling into the new building. Many offices are still in some disarray but functioning. The storage lockers were supposed to have been shipped on December 9th but we are still waiting. The last update put a ship date for January 9th. We have accomplished the move of the large storage file from the old records room to be used in evidence and many areas are coming together. An official invite will be sent next week, once we confirm storage locker delivery, but we are looking for an official open house

for the public on January 21 from 4 to 6 PM. Council is welcome to stop by an visit at any time.

With the move we are also adopting new hours for police records or what we refer to as our business hours. That will be Monday thru Friday 9AM to Noon and 1 to 4 PM. These hours are intended for times people can get copies of reports, vin checks, fingerprints, etc. Inside the south entry is a public access intercom which allows 24 hour access to communications for requesting an officer.

With all the activity in communications the statistics are not available for November. However, from the December numbers you can see that activity in communications was not affected by the move.
