The police department, on behalf of the City, applied for and received a grant from the Colorado Statewide Internet Portal Authority (SIPA). The grant was for \$2500 to be used for development of a program whereby the City can tap into phone app technology to share information with the public. As part of the grant process was for me to attend a daylong conference in Denver to learn more about SIPA. I had heard of SIPA in passing but the training was informative. SIPA has been around for 10 years and exists for the purpose of getting government at all levels on the internet to interact with the public. They provide some free services and equipment as well as serving as the research and government bidding point for other technology geared toward internet communications. More information will be coming concerning the app development.

Communication's continued making changes in February with Jodie Chinn being promoted to Communications Supervisor. Selection for a new communications officer has also been taking place and a conditional offer has been made pending background.

Bel, Melanie and Meredith toured Gunnison High School and Gunnison Community Schools with Officer Whiting. Bel and Meredith also ventured down to Lake City for a tour of that area with the Hinsdale Sheriff's Office. It helps the dispatchers to be familiar with different areas when trying to dispatch officers so they can visualize what they may be hearing on the radio.

With the new communications system we are also able to get our own 911 call data and not rely on the phone company. So you will no longer get the note that 911 calls are pending on the monthly report.
