

POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT

April 4, 2014

The Police Department took a missing persons report for a WSCU student on April 1, 2014. The student had not been seen since March 29, 2014. On April 2, 2014 the students vehicle was located 8 miles east of Gunnison and the student was found deceased a short distance away on BLM property. The death is under investigation.

Sentencing for Zachary Hurley, charged in the homicide case from January 2013 occurred in March. Mr. Hurley was sentenced to 32 years.

As you may have noticed I combined the statistical numbers for Disorderly Conduct and Disturbing the Peace under a new category Public Disorder/Peace.

Rob has been busy in the schools teaching classes in the seventh grade and starting 4th grade classes the end of March into April. He has also started scheduling DARE classes for the kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grades to start later this spring. He also worked with the GHS Student Leadership, State Patrol, Fire and Ambulance to stage a DUI car accident in front of the high school on April 2nd. The accident was coordinated with other activities at the high school to encourage smart choices for prom.

MOU concerning the Law Enforcement Advocate position is still being reviewed by the other parties involved. So far I have verbal approval from agency heads but waiting for attorney's in one instance and will be back to council in a couple weeks. I have also been contacted by Hinsdale County who would like to enter into the arrangement also.

Computer working Group met on March 27th and viewed a web presentation from a company offering a service to provide mobile apps. The City has obtained a \$2500 grant to fund the project from SIPA. We will be meeting in April to discuss further how we can apply the technology and benefits of moving forward.

The animal shelter is rumored to be completed in April and ready for animals in May. I have been in contact with GVAWL and a meeting is planned for April 10th to discuss operational plans.

Bel, Melanie, Caree, and Jessica attended a CTO training March 24-26, that was held here in our conference/training room. There were also two dispatchers from Vail and two dispatchers from Summit County that attended.

Meredith McClurkan successful completed her 3 month training period and has been assigned a shift as of March 25th. Meagan Skulley joined us on March 18th, beginning her 3 month training period. With her successful completion, Dispatch will be fully staffed.
