Rob is busy with classes at the public school teaching the Second Step Curriculum in the 7th and 4th grade and starting classes in 2nd grade. In total he is working with about 230 kids. The Second Step Program is a research and evidence based curriculum that addresses multiple aspects of development and behavior, including prevention.

Rob held a class at GVH for expectant parents on how to correctly install child seats and what to prepare for as their child grows. Approximately 10 expectant parents attended. Rob helped the State CPS coordinator to recertify Child Passenger technicians at a class held in Gunnison. Additionally, Rob did 15 child seat education/inspections during the month.

Caleb McDowell is the newest addition to the police department starting on April 30, 2014. Caleb completed the officer selection process several months ago before entering into the POST Academy in Delta which he completed April 25th. Caleb is now in the department's field training officer program.

Keith, Laurie and Tara attended a Social Media Training on 04/07. The benefits of using Twitter and Facebook to your advantage were explored. The Gunnison Regional 9-1-1 Center now has a Facebook (FB) page and Twitter account...We invite you to 'like' us

and follow the public safety information that we share. We are also looking at advantages to having separate accounts for the police department as communications is involved on a larger community scale.

Working with the computer working group we are pursuing the implementation of a smart phone app which would allow for individuals to receive information on their cell phones as well as communicate limited information back to the City. This is all part of trying to find ways to stay connected in an ever increasing mass communications era. The police department currently uses CodeRed for emergency phone notifications to permanent phone locations. Text notifications are available through CodeRed for emergencies only and NIXLE for emergency and administrative alerts. Both CodeRed and Nixle are free subscription services available to the community to sign up for.

Jessica, Melanie, and Jodie as part of their outreach project did a presentation at Lake School and the Elementary School on 04/17 and 04/18 regarding proper use of 9-1-1 to students.

Rob, Jerry and Nate attended the A.L.I.C.E. Training, (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evade) which we hope to introduce to the schools Rob and Grace also attended a week long FBI Hostage Negotiator Training. Grace and Jerry also certified 6 officers on the new model of Taser received this year.

Members of the Gunnison Police Department, patrol and communications took place in the TRI-Annual Mass Casualty Incident drill/exercise that took place on April 23, 2014 on the airport grounds. This exercise tested the abilities of the first responders, Gunnison Communication, emergency groups, GVH and other entities of Gunnison County to affectively handle a Mass Casualty Incident.
