The Community School was broken into during the night on 9/19 and over \$1,000 in damage was done inside the building. Three high school students were identified last week as being involved. They have been referred to the district attorney office for charges.

On 09/22/2014 the police department working with WSCU held the 10th Good Neighbor Program. The goal is to create better relations between WSCU students, police and full time residents of the City of Gunnison. Joe Engleman developed and runs the program. He first meets with volunteer student leaders from WSCU and provides them with a 30 minute presentation about local issues which require police attention when college is in session. The second component is for the student leaders and police officers to go door to door in areas that historically show a high occurrence of disturbing the peace calls and underage alcohol violations. The student leaders then interact with the residence both, students and full time residents, using what they learned at the presentation to help everyone be better neighbors. They provided residents with brochures which contained information with valuable insights on how to be a better neighbor and local ordinances.

9/27/14 was another prescription drop off event with 43.4 pounds collected at City Market. The police department conducts a full time drop off location which added 63.4 pounds to the total collected for the event. We appreciate the help from City Market, GCSAPP and local law enforcement agencies to staff the City Market drop off when

open. The advantage to these anonymous drop offs is to keep medication out of our sewer systems, landfills and reduce the medications falling into the wrong hands.

The police department with POST funding sponsored two days of training last week entitled “Ending Violence against Women”. The class focused on domestic violence and sexual assault and was attended by law enforcement advocates, district attorney’s advocates, confidential advocates, attorneys and law enforcement officers.
