On 12/09/14 the police department concluded a drug investigation working with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). Two individuals were arrested for and charged with unlawful distribution of cocaine. One of the individuals resides in Gunnison and the other resides in Center. Both individuals were arrested in the 800 block East Tomichi Avenue.

Applications are being accepted for the Law Enforcement Victim Advocate. Application deadline is December 29th with interviews planned for right after the start of the New Year.

November had Rob teaching Second Step in 2nd and 4th grades and DARE in 5th grade for a total of approximately 300 kids in the three grades. Rob was also in the high school health class with approximately 60 kids covering the effects of alcohol, drinking and driving and possible consequences.

Rob is involved with the Western Regional Occupant Protection team which is planning safety events for 2015 and certification classes for the western slope. The group makes free car seats available for low income households as well as provides free safety inspections for child safety seats on request.

Road closures for the Night of Lights went well with public works and the police department coordinating the closure of Main Street and Tomichi Ave so that everyone could move freely through the intersection. The weather cooperated and the crowd seemed a little bigger than last year.

For those into social media the police department just started a Facebook page. We had been putting some items on the Communications Facebook page. But with animal ordinance changes and more information available related specifically to police matters it made sense to start a more specific page. So check out the page.

On November 14th a test of the “CodeRED” Emergency Notification system was conducted. The test amounted to sending a test message to all land-line phones and registered cell phones in our 911 response area. Once the data is compiled we will know how many of the possible phone numbers called, were actually reached helping us in future planning for emergencies. The 911 Board and emergency service agencies are continuing to encourage people to register their cell phones with “CodeRED” as an added contact method in the event of an emergency. Additionally, many people don’t even have a land-line phone in their residence and without registering they are not part of any local emergency notification system.
