

Cases of interest in April are; two unrelated drug cases involving three individuals who admitted to taking LSD. One of the individuals was hospitalized from effects of the drug. In another case officers responded to a noise complaint and found a female party unconscious in an apartment. Officers performed CPR on the individual until the ambulance arrived. The individual was treated at the hospital for a heroin overdose. Also, found in the apartment was a marijuana grow operation which is under investigation. In a burglary cases the home owner returned home to find an individual inside his residence with several items collected and preparing to leave the residence. There was a minor physical altercation at the residence and at another location in town before officers were notified and the suspect arrested.

Last month I report that Scott Morrill, Gunnison County Emergency Manager, had advised us that the police department would be receiving 27 radios valued at \$39,169 from the 2015 Homeland Security Grant applied for by the west region. Today I learned that the grant awarding date had been miss read and the radios will not be available until the 2016 grant release. Good news is the radios are approved and it is one less thing that has to be purchased with City funds. We will now have the time to address programing and related expenses as part of the upcoming 2016 budget.

Members of the department participated in the following trainings during April;
 Seven tele communicators and 4 police supervisors attended a Suicide Awareness training in Montrose for emergency service workers.
 Five tele communicators and two police supervisors attended a Pipeline Emergency Awareness Training held in Mt Crested Butte

With funding from a homeland security grant a wireless projector system was purchased for the police department conference room and installed at no cost to the City.

The police department still has an open position for the parking control officer. Only one application has been received and the position will remain open until filled. Interested individuals can be directed to Captain Wilson for information.

Work is continuing on criminal ordinances related to marijuana use, sales, cultivation, etc. We are also working on adoption of the policy manual from Lexipol as well as planning for the events happening this summer.
