

Typically I try and start the monthly report with what stands out for the last month in regards to criminal activity. For whatever reason nothing stands out beside we are moving into the summer months and activity is picking up. Overall the department is busy with a wide variety of calls. Year to date the department has taken 938 reports, made 219 arrests and issued 616 citations compared to the same period last year of 887 reports, 158 arrests and 743 citations. With all the activities scheduled in Gunnison for the next several weeks I don't see our activities slowing down any.

With public school out for the summer Rob has transitioned back into more of a patrol function. He will still be the main contact for community education but will be seen around town on bike patrol utilizing the new bikes purchased on the LLEG Grant. In total the department purchased three bikes which are available to the officers for use on patrol. The bikes are a great way to patrol areas not accessible by vehicles, when visibility is an issue, for bike enforcement and a large part of the function is to educate bicycle riders and vehicles in the rules of the road.

The part time parking position remains unfilled so please direct anyone interested to Captain Wilson. Comparatively we also announced a need for interpreters and have received inquiries from several people wanting to provide their services. The interpreters are not hired as employees but compensated at an hourly rate as a contracted service.

Several months ago Communications started the process of changing their Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) program. The Communications Board agreed with the program change and the Emergency 9-1-1 Board followed suite electing to pay for the new system. Basically the EMD program consists of established medical procedures that can be explained over the phone to help persons at the scene of an emergency provide first aid until emergency services can arrive. Dispatchers completed the initial 32 hours of training in May and started using the new procedures in June 3rd.

During the council tour we discussed how communications serves emergency agencies in Gunnison and Hinsdale Counties. Reflected in the monthly stats are the combined numbers for all agencies. A breakdown of some of those totals helps demonstrate how busy communications may be when everything in Gunnison is calm. For fire pages in May; Gunnison Fire was 17, Crested Butte Fire was 16 and Hinsdale Fire was 2. Ambulance pages in May were; Gunnison 66, Crested Butte 27, and Hinsdale 10.
