

Reported offenses remain consistent with public order crime increasing slightly in August and DUI's increasing both in August and July. Of the 13 reported DUI's in August three were charged as being under the influence of drugs. Officers also placed three individuals either in jail or at the hospital on emergency protection hold for alcohol/drugs and two individuals were transported out of Gunnison for mental health holds. There were also two sexual assaults report in August that remain under investigation. The cases are not related and the suspect is identified in one of the cases. The second incident involves a 32 year old woman from Colorado Springs, Colorado reported she was sexually assaulted on 08/13/15 in her vehicle while parked on the North side of Legion Park. An unidentified male suspect befriended the victim who could not get her car to start.

We received notification that the VALE Board will provide partial funding for the Law Enforcement Victim Advocate position in 2016 in the amount of \$14,431.

Safe Ride celebrated 20 years of free, no-questions asked rides on September 5<sup>th</sup>. Thanks to the City for supporting Safe Ride in so many ways! Safe Ride is a private effort but has it's foundation as a police department function and Rob is still involved in the non-profit.

Rob participated with the citizen bike safety group and helped with the Bike Train on 9/9. One of the outcomes of that event is the establishment of 5 safe bike routes in town that kids can utilize. Routes will be marked and continue to be advertised at events.

Rob is working with the Community School staff to start prevention programs. He will be working with Mike Casey (grade school counselor) for the planning and teaching. Basic plan at this point is:

- DARE for the fall semester in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade. This will be complimented with one or more blocks from Second Step in the spring. Empathy, emotional management, or problem solving.
- Teaching 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Second Step all year to the five classes with 22 lessons. This is the entire program.
- Working with the 7<sup>th</sup> grade to try to find a way to get Second Step to all kids, as the life skills class has become an elective.
  - We will also look at getting Second Step into the other grades, from pre-school through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. This will involve, Mike Casey, some Lake School teachers and the GCSAPP prevention educator.

Officer's Ashe, Chubbuck and Rob will be working with resident advisors from multiple halls at WSCU to do an alcohol, drinking and driving fatal vision golf cart activity near Chipeta hall on September 10th.

Good Neighbor program is scheduled for September 17<sup>th</sup> with Sgt. Engleman organizing the efforts.

A prescription take back program is scheduled for City Market on September 26<sup>th</sup>. This is in addition to the ongoing drop off point at the Police Department. We are also working with GCSAPP and the Sheriff's Office to develop a disposal program at the airport for passengers arriving with marijuana that cannot board the airplane.

Officer attended training in August on legal updates and court decisions presented by the State District Attorney's Council. We also attended training focused on senior citizens as victims of abuse, domestic violence, stalking and sexual assault presented by the Denver City Attorney's Office.
