

Enforcement activity for October is holding consistent with prior months. We continue to have issues with alcohol consumption and are working with mental health and the jail to determine option for those persons that overconsume to the point of being a danger to themselves. In October 6 individuals were placed in the jail who were unable to care for themselves and no other suitable location was available. Since June 1st that make a total of 20 individuals held for emergency alcohol commits. We are also seeing an increase in heroin use in the community. In October officer responded to two calls where individuals required treatment associated with heroin.

Rob remains active in the public schools. In October he taught the following classes:

- 2nd grade Second Step program taught to five classes Monday through Friday. Approximately 30 minutes to all of the 2nd grade (over 100 children)
- 5th grade DARE, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Taught 45 minute classes to all of the 5th grade. (about 90 students)
- 7th grade Second Step Tuesday through Friday. Taught 45 minute classes to all of the 7th grade. (approx. 100 students)

In addition to teaching he is present in all the buildings visiting with kids and teachers. One of the main objectives with the CRO position is to let the kids get to know police officers. All officers are encouraged to take time to visit the schools. The class taught are intended to interact with as many kids as we can in a positive way to influence positive choice before they become involved in inappropriate behaviors.

Kari is also staying busy with victim advocacy. In October the advocacy program dealt with 37 cases representing 57 victims. That involved 16 cases in Gunnison, 9 cases from the Sheriff's Office and 6 cases each from Crested Butte and Mt Crested Butte.

An inventory of all traffic control signs on intersection in Gunnison was completed in October. Uncontrolled intersection have in the past been the subject of some discussion and safety concern. There are only a few uncontrolled intersection and several that are regulated by yield signs. Based on the inventory and traffic flow all intersections are identified to have stop signs placed on at least one cross street. Sign installation will take place as money, time and weather permit. No significant safety concerns, based on accidents, were located. The additional signage is more to establish consistency and address future concerns as the town develops, vegetation increases, community expectation that controlled intersections are safer and limiting through streets will have some impact on neighborhood street speed..

October saw the first release of policy based on the Lexipol system and the start of the policy training section. Policy will continue to be reviewed and released. The training module allows for the review and testing to apply to all current policy, not just the Lexipol system, so the testing is relevant to all policy in effect.

Progress is continuing with Text to 9-1-1. User accounts have been set up for dispatchers to monitor, and testing of the system began the week of 11/09 with each of the major carriers (AT&T/Verizon/Sprint/T-Mobile). Provided testing continues to go well

we should be live with Text to 9-1-1 in November. A public education/notification program will commence once we know when the system will be available to the public.
