I am reaching out to you and City Council to voice my support for lowering the speed limit to 25 mph within city limits. I live on south Boulevard Street. This street is very wide and has no speed reduction measures in place from Tomichi to Rio Grande. It is also a major thoroughfare for many of the industrial workers who do not realize the number of children that live in residences. Also, the sheriff department uses south Boulevard to access emergencies, which means they travel at very high speeds without emergency lights being activated.

Reduction of speed on all streets would add to safety of other users. I commute by bike most of the time with my daughter in tow. The routes with dedicated bike lanes (Colorado, Spruce, New York, and Spencer) have minimal speed reduction measures. Cars tend to use these routes to by pass traffic lights and other safety measures on Tomichi Avenue and Main Street.

The last thing I would like to mention is that the reduction of speed needs to be enforced. It's amazing to see how many cars speed around town because the current law is not enforced.
